## LIBRARY STUDENT ADVISORY BOARD

### CONSTITUTION

Article I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Library Student Advisory Board of Georgia College & State University.

Article II: MISSION

The Library Student Advisory Board is a student representative organization that informs the students, staff and faculty of issues that involve the Georgia College Library to create a forum for communicating ideas and providing comments on library collections and practices in open, interactive meetings.

Article III: OBJECTIVES

1. To provide a forum for student input on the library's collection and practices.
2. To help students learn more about the library and promote books, reading, and technology.
3. To improve library services for the student population.
4. Organization of programs that highlight the library and its use.

Article IV: MEMBERSHIP

Representatives

The Library Student Advisory Board shall be comprised of one representative from each college, two graduate students, and a member-at-large appointed by the SGA.

Replacement of Members

A seat held by a student who changes his or her college of study shall be declared vacant. In the event that a representative must vacate his or her seat before the end of the specified term, the Secretary will request that the department chair select a new representative for that program.

Article V: MEETINGS AND QUORUM

Meetings

The Library Student Advisory Board is to meet at least once a semester during the school year. If more frequent meetings are needed, it is the responsibility of the Board to reach a consensus as to when the extra meetings will take place.

Quorum

Quorum to conduct business shall be defined as one-half of the membership. Motions shall be carried by a simple majority vote of those present.

Article VI: COMMITTEES

Committees shall be formed at the discretion of the Board.

Article VII: AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Constitution may be proposed by any representative of the Library Student Advisory Board at any meeting. Amendments to the Constitution must be passed by two-thirds majority vote of the Board Representatives.

Article VIII: RATIFICATION

This Constitution shall go into effect after a two-thirds majority affirmative vote by the Library Student Advisory Board and with the signature of the Director of the University Library.
