New Program-Masters of ARTS (M.A.) in Art Therapy

The proposed Master of Arts degree in Art Therapy will provide quality education at the post baccalaureate level which will create competent effective healthcare professionals in the field of Art Therapy. "Art Therapy is the clinical application of art and psychology as a vehicle for communication, healing and growth..."

New Program- Doctor of Nursing Practice

The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program I designed to 1) prepare nurse leaders and nurse clinicians in evidence-based practice nurses; 2) foster a highly educated nursing workforce; 3) increase the supply of faculty for clinical instruction; 4) expand the knowledge base of advanced practice nurses; 5) provide terminal academic preparation for nursing practice; 6) improve nursing care outcomes; and 7) provide an additional skill set to place advanced practice nurses at healthcare decision-making tables.

Masters in Education Literacy and Language Proposal

The Masters of Education in Literacy and Language will develop teachers with professional knowledge and expertise to assume the role of reading specialists in schools and school districts in Central Georgia. This program represents extensive professional development in the field of literacy, involving reading, writing, language development, instruction, assessment, and professional leadership. The foundation of this new program is constituted in three primary areas: 1) Professional knowledge and practices in literacy development and instruction; 2) specialized training in assessment, interpretation of test scores, and formulation of data-driven instructional programs; and 3) leadership and mentoring development. The culmination of this degree will be eligibility for certification as a reading specialist.
